A NOTE FROM THE CEO

As I reflect on 2025, I am proud of the year Camp Mohawk experienced and grateful for the community that made it possible. The summer was full and vibrant, with every cabin filled to capacity and a strong sense of joyful energy across camp. Our campers thrived in an environment shaped by thoughtful leadership, positive role models, and a staff team that balanced professionalism with joy. The directors and counselors who led our program last summer set a high standard, and I am thankful that many of them will return in 2026 to build on that success.

One of the most rewarding aspects of the year was seeing how recent facility improvements directly enhanced the camper experience. The Ute cabin renovations made a meaningful difference in comfort and livability, particularly during periods of extreme heat, and reinforced the importance of investing in projects that support campers' daily lives. At the same time, our work at Camp Mohawk is never confined to a single season. We continue to move steadily from project to project, strengthening infrastructure while carefully planning for what lies ahead. Larger initiatives, including an additional Shower House and a future Dining Hall, are being considered with long-term vision, recognizing that thoughtful design, responsible planning, and patience are essential to doing this work well.

Behind every successful season is a committed year-round team. Camp Mohawk benefits from the experience and dedication of a staff that knows this place deeply and cares about its future. Mikayla, Jo, my father Fran, DJ, and Dan have each been part of camp for four years or more, providing continuity, stability, and an unwavering commitment to our mission. Their work, alongside the guidance of our Board of Directors and the generosity of our donors, ensures that Camp Mohawk remains strong and sustainable.

Most importantly, 2025 was a remarkable year because of the broader Mohawk community. Our families, staff, volunteers, donors, and alumni all play a role in creating a place where girls can grow in confidence, independence, and connection. I am honored to help steward this mission and to continue expanding access to the camp experience for as many campers as possible.

The pages that follow share how this collective support translated into real impact over the past year, from the experiences of our campers to the improvements that will shape Camp Mohawk for years to come.





2025 was truly a special year for me, not only as Assistant Director, but as a lover of all things Mohawk. Having a completely full camp (including 140 kids in Session 5!) was absolutely amazing. Seeing the way camp was able to positively impact so many campers is certainly one of my favorite aspects of my job.

This summer, we introduced four upgraded special events that took place on the middle Saturday of each session. For Session 1, we reintroduced Olympics the “old-fashioned way.” Instead of campers competing with their cabins, we split the entire camp into 12 different countries. Campers got to interact with different units and ages, which helped them feel connected to campers outside of their cabins. In Session 2, we celebrated Holidays at Mohawk, complete with an elf hunt, holiday-themed festival booths, and a big game of Rainbow Tag. Color Wars—a camp favorite—took place during Session 3. Finally, Session 4 was a trip around the world. Of course, we had to finish off the big travel day with a movie on the ballfield under the stars! I’m so proud of our program staff, led by Program Director Kylie, who were able to carry out my vision through these awesome events.

I truly cannot talk about the success of the summer without giving credit to our seasonal staff. Our counselors and support staff embraced the Mohawk spirit as soon as they stepped foot on camp. They were wonderful role models for our campers and made the summer memorable for the kids—and for me. To call them superheroes would be an understatement; I’m so grateful for each and every one who dedicated their summer to us.

The end of the summer brought another successful postseason, hosting a record number of alumni, mothers, daughters, and friends. There’s nothing like hearing stories from alumni or seeing the joy on a camper’s face when her mom does the high ropes.

I am looking forward to 2026 and can’t wait to see what we accomplish with our Camp Director, Patrick, once again leading us toward a summer of full cabins, happy campers, and Mohawk magic!

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION: CARING FOR

COMPLETED IN 2025

Completed this past year, these projects reflect our ongoing commitment to caring for camp and the people who call it home each summer.



CONNECTING CAMP THROUGH THE WETLANDS BOARDWALK

Completed in time for the 2025 season, the wetlands boardwalk has become a favorite path for campers moving between program areas. Beyond improving accessibility, the boardwalk invites campers to slow down, observe nature, and better understand the unique ecosystem that surrounds them.



EXPANDING COMFORT IN THE UTE CABINS

The Ute cabins were expanded to improve both capacity and livability, with updated layouts and additional covered porch space. These improvements created a more comfortable and functional home for campers and counselors alike, enhancing daily life in the unit.

GROWING SHADE FOR THE FUTURE

Twelve new trees were planted across camp to increase shade in high-traffic and gathering areas. These plantings will provide comfort for campers and staff in the years ahead while strengthening the long-term health of camp's landscape.

REFRESHING THE HEALTH CENTER TREATMENT ROOM

The Health Center treatment room received important updates, including new flooring, a vanity, and upgraded fixtures. These improvements support the comfort, efficiency, and professionalism of the care provided to campers throughout the summer.



BRIGHTENING SHARED SPACES WITH LED LIGHTING

All lighting in the Rec Hall and Dining Hall was upgraded to energy-efficient LED fixtures. This transition improved visibility and safety while reducing energy usage and supporting Camp Mohawk's commitment to sustainability.

A NEW HOME FOR CERAMICS

The ceramics program found a new home this year with a renovated and thoughtfully redesigned space. The move created a safer, more functional environment for campers to explore creativity, learn new skills, and express themselves through hands-on art.



CAMP, BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

PREPARING FOR SUMMER 2026

With generous donor support, these projects are being completed to ensure camp is ready to welcome campers in the year ahead.

NEW WATERFRONT EQUIPMENT BUILDING AND WATERFRONT BATHROOM

Construction of the new waterfront equipment building took place following the 2025 camp season and is now complete and ready for use in 2026. This purpose-built space provides secure, organized storage for boats, life jackets, and program equipment, improving safety and daily operations at one of camp's most active areas.

Also at the waterfront, an additional bathroom and washing station is being added near the changing hut to improve accessibility and convenience for campers and staff. This project supports smoother program transitions and better hygiene at busy waterfront areas.



UPGRADING THE LIGHTHOUSE WATER SYSTEM

A major upgrade to the Lighthouse water tank and plumbing system is in progress to ensure consistent, reliable water service. This behind-the-scenes project is critical to maintaining safe and dependable infrastructure across camp.



RENEWING THE DINING HALL PORCH

The Dining Hall porch renovation will create a more weather-resistant and inviting space to better enable movement and salad bar space in the Dining Hall. This update will help make one of the most frequently used areas on camp more camper-friendly.



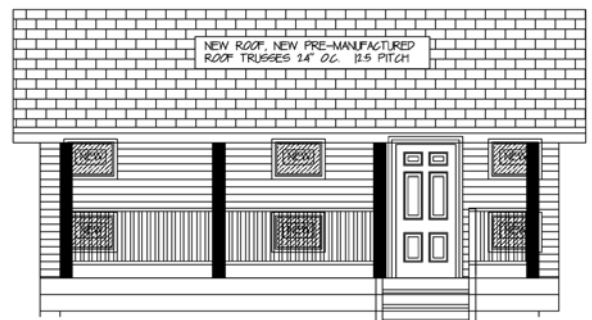
STRENGTHENING THE BARN FOR THE FUTURE

Work is underway to renovate the barn's interior, including replacing rotting structural beams to ensure long-term safety and stability. New animal pens and a dedicated tack room will create a more functional and welcoming space for campers in riding and animal programs. These improvements, made possible through donor support, will preserve a cherished part of camp for years to come.

JAWAK UNIT UPGRADES

The Jawak cabins are receiving new windows to improve ventilation, temperature regulation, and overall comfort. In conjunction with the newly insulated walls installed in 2025, these updates will help create healthier indoor spaces during warm summer months.

Also in the Jawak unit, construction of a new pavilion will provide a covered gathering space for activities, meetings, and downtime. This flexible space will support programming in all weather and strengthen the Jawak community.



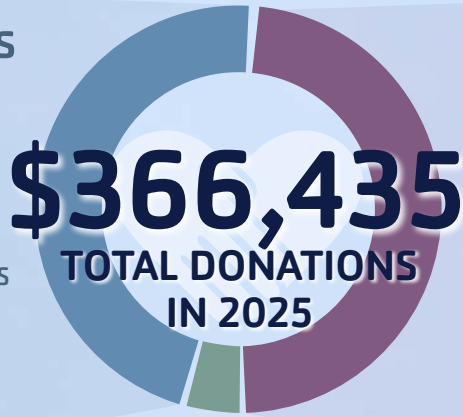
MOHICAN CABIN RENOVATION

The Mohican cabins are being renovated with an updated interior footprint and all-new windows, walls, flooring, and roofing. These improvements will significantly enhance insulation and temperature regulation, creating more comfortable living spaces during increasingly hot summers. Modeled after the successful Ute cabin upgrades completed last year, this renovation will ensure the Mohican cabins remain safe, durable, and welcoming homes for campers for years to come.
