A NOTE FROM THE CEO

2024 was an outstanding year for YMCA Camp Mohawk. Our enrollment reached full capacity, with as many campers as we can take, reflecting the growing enthusiasm for the unique experiences we provide. This robust participation has enabled us to continue expanding and enhancing our offerings.

Significant strides were made in advancing our Master Site Plan, with several impactful additions aimed at improving the camper experience. We installed woodsheds and water spigots in every unit, constructed a pavilion in Utes, built a nature boardwalk through the wetlands and added a roof over the porches in Jawak cabins. Additionally, the much-anticipated Shower House behind Jawaks was completed just in time for the summer season. The completion was particularly fortuitous, as an unforeseen event—a large oak tree falling onto the Lighthouse building—occurred on the first day of staff training. While these events remind us of the unpredictability of camp life, they also highlight the resilience and adaptability of our leadership team.

Under Mikayla's leadership in staff hiring, training, and programming, our team has flourished. The staff have embraced the balance of professionalism and fun that defines the Mohawk experience, and I am incredibly proud of their performance. Their energy, dedication, and enthusiasm continue to set the tone for a positive and enriching environment. I am very proud of this past summer's staff and with those returning for this coming summer, I am confident that we will build on this success.

The Board of Directors has been instrumental in ensuring that Camp Mohawk remains a safe and vibrant space for future generations. Their unwavering commitment and hard work inspire me daily. This coming year, we are embarking on our first Capital Campaign in over 40 years, a significant milestone for our organization. With a dedicated consultant, a motivated committee, and Development Director, Jo Anderson, we are poised to take on this ambitious initiative. The goal of the campaign is to build a new Dining Hall, a critical project that will enhance the camp experience for decades to come. While this endeavor is new territory for many of us, I am eager to lead us forward with optimism and determination.

Heading into 2024, I was eager to see what the summer would bring. I felt like we had a solid full-time team, operations were moving along smoothly, and we were really able to focus on how to create an even better summer for campers and staff.

We introduced a new staff hiring scheme for 2024 to make sure we can fully staff every cabin without having to piecemeal in counselors. This meant that staff had to commit to either working the first half of the summer, the second half of the summer, or the entire summer. While these new guidelines were a bit of an adjustment, I did see success having every cabin staffed going into the summer, and having the staff be consistent throughout the summer. As always, I think that we had the best staff an Assistant Director could ask for. They showed up with smiles on their faces ready to work at any task the day may bring. I was so impressed with the effort and dedication they put into their work, and not to mention the awesome special event costumes they put together!

A new project I was tasked with in 2024 was completing the necessary requirements for our American Camping Association accreditation. This was definitely a huge undertaking as there are about 350 standards that need to be addressed, most of which needed to have written documentation supporting camp's compliance. I certainly learned a lot through spear-heading this process, but I couldn't have done it without the help of Patrick, Jo, and Fran. Thankfully, all the hard work paid off and we received 100% on all the standards during our inspection in July! I certainly learned a lot throughout the experience, and I am happy to maintain our ACA accreditation. I'm so proud of our camp and all that we are doing to stay on track with the high level that the ACA thinks camps should be at.

There is no doubt the all-camp activities are a highlight every summer. With the addition of our Program Director, Emily, we had all new special events every session with unique themes like Monster High, Strawberry Shortcake, and the Hero Games just to name a few.

This fall, we introduced a second Mother Daughter Weekend due to such high demand. It is so great to see the campers excited to show their moms a glimpse into camp life for a weekend and being able to give that experience to over 200 mothers and daughters is so fulfilling. With our post groups growing each year, I am excited to welcome even more Mohawkers, family, friends, and community members into the magic that is Mohawk.

As we close out 2024, we are just about 90% full for 2025 already. That is a huge testament to our counselors, support staff, and Patrick, our Camp Director, for leading the charge in continuing to make camp a special place that girls can come to grow to become the best versions of themselves.

I am looking forward to another amazing summer in 2025!

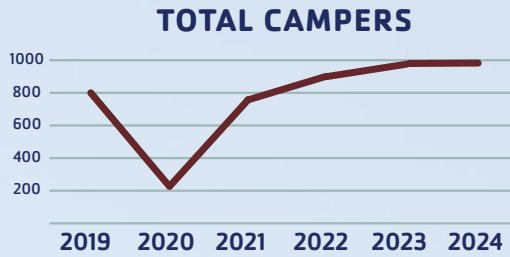

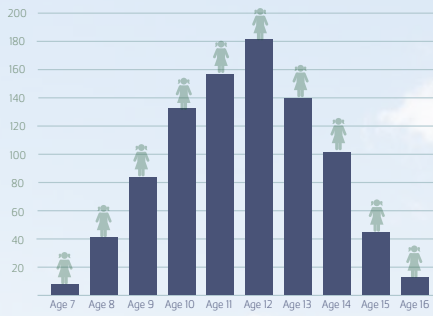

BUILDING MOHAWK'S FUTURE

To preserve the high-quality Mohawk experience and secure long-term sustainability, Camp Mohawk is dedicated to thoughtfully planning and maintaining its facilities and grounds for all who participate in or visit camp. Guided by the priorities set in the Strategic Plan, significant progress has been made in implementing the Master Site Plan. The timeline below highlights completed, ongoing, and upcoming projects that reflect this commitment to excellence and growth.



UNDERGROUND WIRES

To alleviate the continued potential for power and phone outages from summer storms, all the overhead wires on camp were buried.



JAWAK SHOWER HOUSE

Completed just in time for the start of the 2024 camp season, this building doubled the shower capacity on camp, providing 10 showers and two ADA bathrooms. Located near the youngest camper's cabins, this facility made it possible for every camper to shower each evening over the summer. Construction was made possible through grant funding from the Y-USA, a successful Brick Campaign, and use of operating funds.

TREEHOUSE BUNK BEDS

Built in bunk beds were added to the treehouse, making it possible for campers to spend the night out there!

SECURITY GATE

Installed at the entrance to camp, the security gate enhances safety and provides better control over access to the property. This addition ensures a secure and welcoming environment for all campers, staff, and visitors.

UNIT UPGRADES

Firewood sheds were built for each unit at Camp Mohawk, ensuring easy access to wood for campfires and fostering a sense of community around shared outdoor traditions. Additionally, a covered pavilion was built for the Ute Unit, providing a versatile, sheltered space for activities and gatherings in all weather conditions.

REC HALL RENOVATION

A much-needed upgrade to the interior of the Rec Hall saw the addition of wood paneling, improving the experience of campers and families utilizing this building.





BATHROOM RENOVATION
The bathrooms in the Baking building were renovated to provide additional restrooms for both visitors and campers. This upgrade enhances convenience and accessibility, ensuring a more comfortable experience for everyone on camp.

ALL-CAMP GENERATOR
Power outages are now a thing of the past with the 2024 installation of a high-capacity generator, capable of powering the entire camp, including anticipated future needs. The system is fully automatic, ensuring that power is seamless when an outage occurs, enhancing safety and reliability for campers and staff.

WETLANDS BOARDWALK
Set to be completed and ready for campers in 2025, progress has begun on building a boardwalk from the ballfield to the waterfront. This scenic path will allow campers to explore and appreciate the wetlands that are a part of Mohawk's ecosystem.

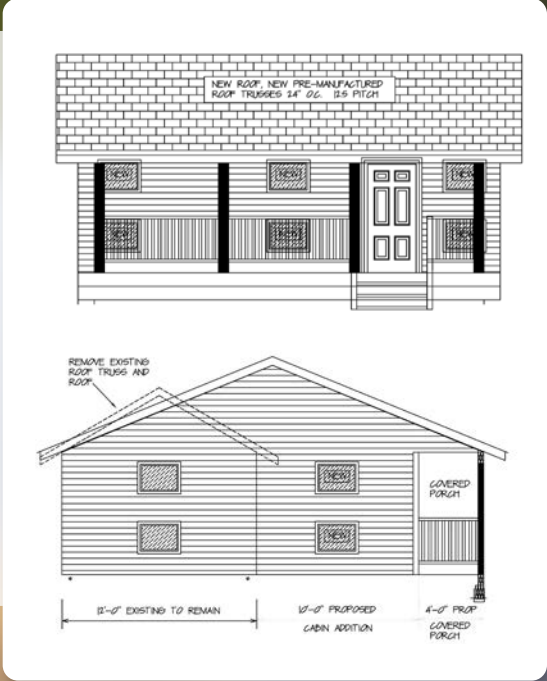
FUTURE CAPITAL PROJECTS

2025 **Beyond**

JAWAK COVERED PORCHES
Roofs were added to the two Jawak cabin buildings. This improvement has given many benefits including a covered place for Fun Factors and a means of keeping the mud and rain from tracking into the cabins.



UTE CABIN EXPANSIONS
Progress has begun on expanding the five Ute cabins to increase capacity from 8 to 10 campers. This project will also see the addition of a covered porch, expanded counselor area and overall floor space, making these cabins a more comfortable and spacious place for campers.
